THE HEADMASTER'S REPORT

In 2009 we witnessed the end of the bitter civil war that had ravaged our beloved motherland for over 30 years. While all the problems of the nations have by no means been resolved, at least we are a nation of people that no longer has to worry about a war. The hard task of rebuilding our nation has now to be pursued so that all Sri Lankans, irrespective of ethnicity, caste, class or creed, can fully enjoy the benefits of peace for which so much blood was shed.

The year under review also witnessed continued progress in all spheres of life at the School about which the Report in your hands will give you an indication

The Chapel

Actg. Chaplain: The Headmaster Senior Sacristan: J. C. Rodrigues

We thank and praise God that during the year 2009 we continued to have a full Chapel at services. The life of the Chapel continued with regular morning and night prayers as well as celebrations of the Holy Eucharist on Sunday mornings.

During the Lent Term we had Bro. Michael Grace tSSF from the Archdiocese of York in the UK serving as a volunteer Lay Chaplain. He did much to bring in systems and discipline among the Altar Servers and ensured that everything was done 'decently and in order'. Unfortunately due to a serious health condition he had to return to the UK in time for Easter. We are grateful to him for all he did for the Chapel and School community.

The Revd Bro. Lionel Peiris SSF of Devasaranaramaya was present as our Guest Preacher at the annual Patronal Festival of the Chapel on St. Francis of Assisi Day, 4th October 2009. He conducted a special seminar on St. Francis of Assisi and the Franciscan Way after the Solemn Eucharist and Fellowship Breakfast.

Our annual Service of Lessons and Carols for Christmas in three languages was held on the last Sunday of the Michaelmas Term.

Fr. Harold Goodchild, Chaplain Emeritus together with Fr Saman Jayasuriya, an ordained Anglican Deacon, were a great source of support to the Headmaster with regard to the chaplaincy and in the absence of a full time Chaplain. Mr. M. J. L. Rajapakse, licensed Lay Reader, assisted with the administration of the chalice at the Sunday Eucharist until his departure to join Government Service. We are thankful to him for his contribution.

A number of donations were received towards the upkeep of the Chapel, its furnishings and hangings etc. A new set of Vestments and a Cope were also presented together with a new set of six silver candle stands for the High Altar, a Cruet Set and two flags. A sound system has also been installed.

A statue of St. Francis of Assisi that had been damaged was restored by the Art Master and was blessed at the Chapel Feast.

Numbers

We have still to reach the right number of students that is crucial to our survival. As in 2007 and 2008 we admitted children throughout the year, but just as much as we did so, a number of factors also resulted in children leaving us during the year. There were many reasons for these departures, chief among them the inability of parents to pay fees or ill health.

Examination Results and Work

We presented 30 students for the Grade Five Scholarship Exam in 2009. As in the two previous years only one of them qualified with 143 marks.

42 students were presented for the G. C. E. Ordinary Level Examination 2009 of whom 52% qualified to follow Advanced Level courses. While comparing the results with those of the previous years progress is evident. For example, after a break of 15 years there were 100% passes in

Sinhala and Buddhism and an improvement in the Mathematics and English results too.

A number of our boys have already obtained entry to our parent School at Mount Lavinia to follow Advanced Level courses in all streams and disciplines.

Buildings, Equipment and Infrastructure Development

All our infrastructure work undertaken during the year was carried out with external funding as we had done since 2007.

A large donation by the members of Harper House of Sherborne School, Dr. R. L. Hayman's alma mater in the UK, enabled us to effect many significant repairs, renovations and replacements.

The entire Upper School block received a new asbestos sheet roof, the Middle School block was refurbished, all the classroom blocks and the dining hall were given pavements for the proper disposal of rain water that was causing problems to the foundations, a new 'chummery' was opened below the Simon Perera Block of Middle School classrooms for the single resident masters, the entire College Office was given a ceiling and the examination unit was enlarged to house a new duplo machine for printing exam papers among a number of other significant items.

In addition the former Isolation Room was refurbished to serve as a guest house for old boys and parents to generate a small income for the School. The facility is monitored strictly to ensure that there will be no mis use.

The STCG OBA refurbished the Read Junior dormitory and also constructed a brand new set of toilets and washroom for the Junior dorm block that greatly enhanced the facilities we offer our boarders.

Phase 1 of the Swimming Pool refurbishment project was started in December, sponsored by three individual members of the OBA at a cost of Rs 2 million. When Phase 2 is completed the Guru Pool will be one of the best in the region and the School will be able to generate an income to sustain its upkeep.

The Board continued to support the Administration in the running of the School and provided extra funding from time to time. The Board held one meeting at Gurutalawa and the Manager did visit the School along with the Hony. Treasurer on a number of occasions, but more visits to the School by the entire Board would have been welcome in 2009.

Board presence at significant events such as the Prize Giving too would be encouraging to the students, staff and the parents. Guru has always suffered due to our distance and the encouragement that such a visit and the effect that a personal word or two from a Board member to the Staff can have cannot be underestimated or overstated.

The Old Boys' Association

The Golden Jubilee of the STCG OBA was celebrated in February 2009 during the annual reunion weekend. The 50th AGM was well attended as were the special dinner held thereafter. The presence of pioneer members P. S. Duleepkumar (first Hony. Secretary), Bradman Weerakoon and Gerald de Alwis was very encouraging to all those who had gathered. 5 special trees were planted to commemorate the event by 5 old boys representing the 5 decades of the OBA's existence.

A week later a special Service of Thanksgiving was held in the Chapel of the Transfiguration, S. Thomas' College, Mount Lavinia, to celebrate the Golden Jubilee. The Revd Jayanth Jeyaweerasingham, an old boy of Gurutalawa, preached the sermon, while the Headmaster celebrated the Eucharist assisted by the Chaplain of STC Mount Lavinia the Revd Rebecca Mathew and the Lay Chaplain of STC Gurutalawa, Bro. Michael Grace.

To commemorate the event the OBA financed a new washroom and toilet

block for the Junior Dormitories and also restored the Read Junior dormitory.

The anniversary Fellowship Dinner was held at the Palm Beach Hotel later in the year at which the new Warden of S. Thomas' College, Mount Lavina, the Revd John C. Puddefoot (by virtue of his office Patron of the STCG OBA) was Chief Guest.

I owe a special word of thanks to the dynamic Senior Vice Presidents of 2009 Mr Mahen Ranasinghe and Mr Prabhath Jayasundere, who took over from Mr Mahen Ranasinghe on the latter's departure abroad towards the middle of the year. Their constant support, solidarity and encouragement was helpful to say the least. Mahen Ranasinghe was a dynamo! His tenacity and focused leadership always resulted in the OBA completing much of its goals. We are grateful to him for his contribution to Guru.

At the first Ex-Co meeting for the year Sub Committees were appointed for Education & Faculty Development, Sports Development and Infrastructure Development.

Needless to say that the constant and continued support of the old boy network is crucial for our many infrastructure development projects.

The Parent-Teachers' Association

A small group of concerned parents came forward to revive the PTA in Term 3 of 2009 and made the refurbishment of the College Kitchen, Pantry and Dining Hall their main priority. They also have plans for installing solar heating for the dormitory wash rooms at a later date. A preliminary meeting was held and an action committee was formed thereafter to proceed with the plans. A set of Rules have now been drawn up and it is hoped that many more parents will join the cause of supporting the School in providing improved facilities for their children while they study here as Boarders

Many parents are content to pay fees and assume that this is sufficient, but the reality of a private fee levying school is that paying school fees alone is not sufficient. Parents have to join hands with the management to help with developing the school as well.

The Hayman Foundation

Although the Haymans retired to England in 1964, they never ceased to have links with S. Thomas' College. Dr Hayman passed away in 1983 soon after his last visit to Sri Lanka. Mrs Hayman last visited the School in 1992 when she attended the 50th Anniversary celebrations. She died in November 2007. Soon afterwards the Executors of her Last Will informed the School hat she had left a bequest of 2000 Pounds to the School.

It was felt that the most appropriate way to use this money was to invest in a special Trust Fund that would be part of a new society called 'The Hayman Foundation'. It was decided to name this society thus not just to remember two of our greatest benefactors but also to pay tribute to two people whose devotion to the service of children touched so many others during their time at Guru. They both embodied Bishop James Chapman's ideal 'To spend and be spent in our work is our greatest and best privilege'—that must be a challenge to us who continue what they started.

The objective of the Foundation is to raise funds on a long term basis for the benefit of the College. The Deed of Settlement was signed at a simple ceremony in the shadow of the Chapel of the Transfiguration following Service of Thanksgiving for the 50th anniversary of the Old Boys' Association in March.

The Board of Trustees appointed comprises the Headmaster (Ex Officio), three nominated members of the College Board of Governors [one of whom is the Manager] and two nominated members of the STCG Old Boys' Association.

The funds were invested with the Incorporated Trustees of the Church of Ceylon and will be disbursed by the Trustees on the request of the Headmaster as and when the Endowment Fund reaches 1 million rupees.

Any old Thomian who would like to be part of this venture may become a member of the Hayman Foundation by depositing a sum of no less than 1/3rd of the approximately Rs.300,000/- bequeathed by Mrs Mary Hayman.

CAMPUS FACILITIES Boarding

This year to further enhance the welfare of the Boarders we appointed a Hostel Superintendent whose primary task was to look into the efficient running of the College Hostel.

A Hostel Council chaired by the Headmaster and a number of staff and some student leaders looked into various aspects of the hostel such as food, maintenance etc and met on a monthly basis.

The Sick Room

On the whole the general health of the students was satisfactory although one or two serious cases of illness caused great concern to the entire School community. The Sick Room needs to be upgraded to meet the demands of our resident community.

The College Kitchen & Bakery

We continued to provide a balanced diet for our Boarders at a very reasonable rate. The children continued to have fresh vegetables from our own cultivation plots. They also received fresh milk, chicken and egg during the week.

The cost of running the College Kitchen was very high and the management had to take measures to cut down the cost while maintaining a good quality of food provided.

The Bakery continued to provide the required bread, buns and cakes for the consumption of the College community. The Cookery Club used the facilities for their baking activities as well.

The College Farm

The College Farm continued to be an integral part of the School. The Farm supplied eggs, chicken, milk and vegetables for the use of the School and continued to be a resource for the teaching of Agriculture as well as offering practical hands on training to boys interested in farming.

The College Shop

The College Shop closed at the end of 2008 was outsourced and reopened under new management in Term 3 of 2009. The Shop provided basic necessities required for a Boarding School community.

Film Shows

The Library

The Library Club and Junior Librarians functioned satisfactorily. The modest facilities of our library were used by many students and teachers.

were not active during the year due to the fact that students were not
interested in many of them. Those that functioned were well supported and
the reports speak for themselves.

Student Christian Movement

Bible Studies were held weekly under the auspices of the SCM. Senior
SCM members led morning prayers along with the Lay Chaplain and other
Christian teachers. Some of our boys participated in the SCM Camp
organised at STC Mount Lavinia. SCM students also helped with the
annual Carol Service.

Buddhist Students Society

Teacher in Charge: Mrs. Sita Jayasekera
A special programme was held in the Hall for Poson Poya at which a sermon was delivered by a Buddhist Monk from the area. The Buddhist children continued to meet each morning for meditation before the start of the School day in the junior quadrangle area. They were also taken to the nearby temple for religious observances on Poya Days during the year.

Hindu Students Society

The Society conducted meditation for Hindu students every morning. On special Festival days during the year such as Mahasivarathri the Society organized visits to Kovils in Haputale, Seetha Eliya and Nuwara Eliya for religious observances. Saraswathie Pooja was offered at the Haputale Kovil at a special programme hosted by some Hindu parents in October. Other Hindu rituals were also performed by the students during this visit.

10 students and some of our staff participated in the Hindu Society Programme organised by S. Thomas' College, Mount Lavinia in July.

Some work was done on 'Emergencies' as a Scout must BE PREPARED to deal with situations such as 'when lightening strikes', fires, floods and such things. We have been slow in the winning of badges due to a lack of time and the non availability of examiners. But the scout training is done to

prepare our boys for 'service'. Also the College has a 'floating population' as some boys leave the group for various reasons during the year, chief among them being our difficulty to cater for the bigger boys who need more strenuous and adventurous activities in the programme. Also boys tend to get involved in too many other activities and due to the small number in the school as a whole this is made worse. Scouting aims at training a boy for service. Every proficiency badge prepares a Scout for some sort of service. There are some badges which are PUBLIC SERVICE badges. Public Health, Ambulance etc. Scout training aims at making a boy not self-centered but other-centered. The test is passed or the badge is won to enable him to serve. The second Scout law is 'To help other people at all times'. The spiritual part of scouting is also important. The first Scout law is 'to do my duty to my belief and country'. The Scout programme is incomplete without the time set for SILENCE when we remember the importance of our beliefs.

Our boys get the training that will help them to be useful in society now and surely in their lives when they step out into the world – 'Once a Scout, always a Scout'.

A Cub Pack was started for the Lower School and is progressing slowly.

The Scouts were also in charge of the Flag Hoisting that preceded important School events during the year under review.

The College Magazine

SPORTS AND GAMES

In 2009 we continued to face difficulties in the area of sports due to the lack of committed persons to take charge of the individual sports as well as the lack of competent coaches and necessary resources.

The days of teachers coaching sports after school hours are long gone. The OBA was keen to sponsor a full time Sports Coordinator and a number of applications were received. Unfortunately none of the applicants were satisfactory.

Athletics

Master in Charge and PTI: Mr. S. Medawela The main event of the Athletics calendar in 2009 was the annual Inter House Athletics Meet on 28th February. The Chief Guest was Mr Prabhath Jayasundere. Read House emerged Champions and carried away the D. A. Seneviratne Memorial Challenge Cup.

36 of our athletes competed at the Zonal Meet that was held at Ambagasdowa. 22 took part in the District Meet at Badulla.

Badminton

Master in Charge/Coach: Mr. S. Medawela The annual Inter House Badminton Tournament was held and the Challenge Trophy was won by Hayman House.

40 of our shuttlers also participated in four age groups at the Inter-School Badminton Competition held at S. Thomas' College, Bandarawela.

Rugby Football

Master in Charge/Coach: Mr. V. W. Dikkumbura The annual Inter House Rugby Football Tournament was held and the Canon R. S. de Saram Challenge Shield was won by De Saram House for the second consecutive year.

Our Under 14 and Under 16 teams took part in two inter school competitions.

The Under 14 team played in the Milo Tournament at Ratnapura, winning one match, losing one and drawing one.

The Under 16 team took part in the Milo Tournament at Kurunegala where they won their first match against Sri Rahula College, but lost to St. Thomas' College, Matale.

Cricket

The Under 13 team played 5 matches in Round 1 of the Tournament of which they won 4 while there was no decision in the last due to rain. The team qualified for the 2nd round but lost to Ruwanwella Central College.

Our Under 15 team played 5 matches of which they won 3, lost 1 and drew 1. They unfortunately failed to qualify for Round 2 due to the low run rate.

The Inter House Cricket Tournament was revived and was won by Hayman House.

The annual encounter between STCG and our brother School at Bandarawela, revived by the two Headmasters in 2008 on a small scale at Gurutalawa was played on a much larger scale at the Bandarawela Esplanade. After an initially good start the Guru XI sadly lost the match. The winning team was awarded the Headmasters S. L. A. Ratnayake and Patrick Gunawardene Memorial Challenge Trophies. The Best Bowler Award was won by W. M. L. M. Weerakoon of our School and Best Batsman award was awarded to A. S. Kalpana.

Two of our boys, K. N. K. Gamage and W. A. A. N. Silva were selected for the District Team and played up to the finals.

Basket Ball

Swimming

Swimming went on without a break despite problems with the pool filtration system that occurred from time to time. It is one of the most popular sports activities in the College, especially among the juniors who are very keen. Whatever the weather conditions the boys enjoy a dip in the pool.

We had our Inter House Swimming Tournament at the start of Term 3 due to water problems that prevented us from organising it at the end of Term 2 as usual. Dr Harsha Perera, an old boy and former Captain of Swimming at Guru was the Chief Guest.

The College Swimmers also took part in the Swimming Meet organised at the Diyatalawa Military Academy Pool by the Sri Lanka Army. We won 4 gold medals and three silver medals at this event. Our dream is to take part in the Public Schools Swimming Tournament in Colombo. This would require hard, daily and intensive training and with our boys taking part in so many other activities, intensive training is difficult.

Our swimmers have been divided into 3 groups -A, B & C. If a boy can do only one stroke, he is out in Group C. If he does two strokes, he is in Group B and is able to do three strokes he is in Group A. When he does all four strokes and a dive successfully he becomes a College Swimmer. All our boys aim for this place.

At the end of the year the pool was emptied and refurbishment work was begun. A new filtration system was also planned.

Conclusion

At the end of May I shall be completing three years as Headmaster and will begin my last year under my present contract. What the next step will be remains in the distant and uncertain future. These past three years have been successful, but they have not been free of difficulties and problems. We have overcome and we have stayed the course. Guru has always been a School that has faced such problems, our response to them determines the future direction that we take.

I have become convinced over the past three years that unless we offer something very different to other schools here at Guru our numbers target will never be reached. We need to find what makes an education at Guru unique and special – not merely a Boarding school where parents or guardians who sometimes do not have much choice, leave their children – sometimes as though we are a Reform School or an SOS Childrens' Village. There are a number of options that I have been thinking about.

We could offer vocational education & training especially for students who are not academically capable of facing our public exams. This would be enhanced by the facilities we have here for carpentry, agriculture etc. There is a niche for this type of education among our church schools. In fact the subject known as PTS or Practical Technical Skills that we teach from the Lower 4th to the Middle 6th could be taken forward to the O/L and even A/L stages. We are even hoping to start paper making as part of a programme to make this campus an eco friendly place.

We have the potential to be a 'Sports School' but we lack the staff and resources for this as of now.

One of Jacques Huyghebaert's last proposals before he withdrew in 2008 was that we go up to A/L at Guru and the Board granted permission for me to start A/L for Pure Arts subjects in Sinhala and Tamil. The financial side of the proposal required a minimum of 50 students to make the plan viable and the lack of that number is the reason we have not progressed on this. We have not started it yet due to that number not being available. However, one of the possibilities that may be considered is for us to provide the Pure Arts courses in Sinhala and Tamil for the entire Thomian network that will hopefully ensure numbers, of course only if both Mount

Lavinia and Bandarawela send us their students offering Arts in Sinhala and Tamil while they offer the other disciplines. This is something that will have to be looked at seriously.

So there is still work to be done, and the future, though dark, is filled with endless possibilities.

It is said that 'Talk is Cheap'. What we need is more action on the part of those who claim to have Guru's interests at heart. Our distance from the center inevitably results in us being 'forgotten'. It would be unrealistic and unfair for interest groups and interested individuals to expect the School to thrive out here only with the efforts of the Headmaster and Staff who are on the ground. Pundits have perorated on what the School needs. I invite them to put their words into practice. Pledges and promises are made, but only a small number have actually made good those pledges and promises.

The great Nelson Mandela said after winning the Election to be South Africa's first Black President "After climbing a great hill, one only finds that there are many more hills to climb." This is our almost daily reality here at Guru, but we continue to journey on with faith, hope and love, patience and perseverance.
